"Ethical Chocolate" refers to cocoa that is harvested without the use of forced, child or trafficked labour.\* Look out for chocolate products in this guide or that have the Fairtrade, Rainforest Alliance or UTZ Certified logos on them to be sure your chocolate is ethical chocolate!

\*This term does not seek to classify the use of other ingredients, such as palm oil.
