SYRIAN REFUGEE CRISIS

When home is a park bench: Syrian refugees find nowhere else to go.

For most children a park bench is a place for picnics, sunshine and fun. But for Yasmin, 4, it's home.

She's been living there with her mum, dad and three older brothers since they fled fighting in Syria for Lebanon's Bekaa Valley with just the clothes on their backs.

They stay by the bench all day and at night they sleep in a local mosque or an open train carriage in the town centre.

Yasmin's mum Layla^{*} says that had no choice but to leave Syria as fighting intensified in recent months. They fled when their neighbour's home was attacked. They were terrified theirs would be next.

"All I want is shelter for my children. I don't care about anything else."

Yasmin and her family are among more than 1.7 million Syrians who have fled to neighbouring countries – including Lebanon and Jordan – since fighting started two years ago. An estimated 4.25 million have been forced out of their homes by conflict, and are now displaced within Syria. In Lebanon, some refugees have been able to find accommodation with friends, and some have built makeshift shelters on rented land. Yasmin's family hasn't been able to find shelter anywhere. "All I want is shelter for my children," says Layla. "I don't care about anything else."

Like all parents fleeing Syria for nearby countries, all Layla and her husband Ahmed want is somewhere safe for their children to live. But they couldn't even afford an empty garage. Instead, they call the park, train and mosque home, and scrape together their meagre funds to buy bread for Yasmin and her brothers. It's hard to imagine how they will cope when winter arrives and brings the snow.

"My children are always by my side," says Layla. "They ask me, when are we going to have a home?""

World Vision is working in Jordan and Lebanon, to provide refugee families like Yasmin's with life saving supplies and food vouchers. We are also running Child Friendly Spaces so refugee children have somewhere safe to play and learn.

Situation overview

The UN has called the largest humanitarian appeal in history to help the millions of people affected by the crisis. With no immediate end to the conflict in sight, they face months of uncertainty and not knowing whether they will ever return to normal life.

"We estimate that 6.8 million people now need urgent help. One in three Syrians [are] in need of urgent humanitarian assistance." – Valerie Amos, UN Humanitarian Chief

World Vision's response

World Vision's work in Jordan and Lebanon reaches refugees staying in camps and among host communities. We are assisting by:

- distributing blankets, warm clothing, fuel for heating and cooking, and personal hygiene kits;
- implementing food voucher systems in partnership with the UN World Food Programme that enables the purchase of food items in local shops, to contribute to the local economy;
- operating Child Friendly Spaces to provide refugee children with social and emotional support and a safe environment to play and learn;
- supporting children aged 9-14 years with daily

catch-up classes and fast-track learning program so they can keep up with their education;

• improving access to water, sanitation and hygiene within camps.

Currently World Vision is working with other humanitarian agencies to build the Azraq refugee camp in the Jordan desert. Here, enough sand to fill the Sydney Opera House concert hall three times will be moved in order to create shelter and access to basic needs for some 130,000 children and their families fleeing the Syrian conflict.

"People are fleeing from violence, leaving behind houses, family, jobs, friends and schools," explains World Vision Australia Head of Humanitarian and Emergency Affairs Anthea Spinks. "Half of those fleeing Syria are children, and all the refugees need protection, water, shelter, food and health services."
