


IMPACT VS SKYE

What are the core differences?

The IMPACT Club model is a proven approach to adolescent development of which the SKYE Club model has its origins. The models follow the same philosophy, educational methods, learning framework, and human resource structure, however there are important differences in order to achieve specific learning and life outcomes for both adolescents and youth. These differences are outlined below:

The IMPACT Club model targets adolescents aged between 12 and 17 years




The IMPACT Club model has a 36 month training cycle



The IMPACT Club model has 125 meetings over that period



There is one IMPACT Club training cycle per a four year IMPACT Club project




The IMPACT Club model will reach approximately 550 adolescents and 3000 indirect beneficiaries over the life of a project



IMPACT Club budget is \$200,000 USD for a four-year project

SKYE



SKYE Club model targets youth aged between 18 and 26 years




The SKYE Club model has an 18 month training cycle



There are three 18 month training cycles over a five year SKYE Club project and has 72 meetings



The SKYE Club curriculum more advanced and has a greater focus on employability and entrepreneurship.



The SKYE Club model will reach approximately 1125 youth and 5000 indirect beneficiaries over the life of a project.



SKYE Club budget is approximately 300,000 USD for a five year project
