WHAT IS THE PASSPORT?

The SKYE Passport is a personal learning log. In it, you can keep track of your learning and achievement in SKYE in the following areas:

- Achievement of learning objectives in the SKYE curriculum
- Development of the 5 key competencies

Unlike the Journal, which is a place for self-reflection and discovery, the Passport is a place for self-assessment and recognition. Here you can see, in concrete terms, what you have learned in SKYE. It is then up to *you* to apply that learning to the rest of your life!

Of course, the Passport cannot measure everything that is important about SKYE. It cannot measure the depth of friendships you have developed with your fellow club members. It cannot measure the impact you have had on your community through your service-learning projects – nor the impact that your community has had on you. It cannot measure the commitment you have to putting the values, knowledge, and skills you've learned here into practice in the "real world." Those things are up to you.

HOW DO I USE THE PASSPORT?

The Passport should be used at evaluation meetings, which should happen at the completion of every community service-learning project. At those evaluation meetings, you will spend time reflecting on the learning you have done and the impact you have made as a group through your project. But in addition, your evaluation meetings should include time for personal reflection and evaluation. In particular, this means using the Passport.

There are two evaluation sections to the Passport:

- 1. Development of the five key competencies
- 2. Achievement of learning objectives in the SKYE curriculum

The development of the five key competencies (project management, personal & group management, communication, innovation & creativity, and technical competencies) is the first type of personal development that we hope you get from your involvement with SKYE. The goal of the program is for participants to advance as far as possible in each of the five competency areas, recognizing that each individual is naturally gifted in some areas more than others. However, as you progress through the SKYE program, you should make it your goal to achieve the highest level possible for *you* in each of the five competencies. Remember that competency development involves not only head knowledge or handy skills, but also values and attitudes – these competencies should affect your whole life.

The achievement of learning objectives has a slightly different logic. Although each of the learning objectives in the curriculum is important, not every SKYE member will necessarily be present for every single meeting in which the learning objectives are covered. This means that very few SKYE members will receive 100% of the diplomas for learning objective achievement –and that's okay! Make it your goal to attend SKYE as consistently as possible, learn about a wide variety of topics, and apply that learning to your life – and then collect as many diplomas as you can. There is no penalty for missed diplomas, nor a prize for the most diplomas, so focus instead on the *quality* of what you are learning.

For each of the two parts of the Passport, the process is the same: you will read through a list of indicators and self-evaluate whether or not they are true for you. If you have managed to check off all the indicators in a certain section, it means you have achieved that level of achievement! You should then bring your passport to your SKYE club leader and have him/her confirm that you have truly achieved that level. (Please note: although we trust you to be honest and sincere in this self-evaluation, your SKYE leader may ask you to demonstrate or prove that you truly have the knowledge, attitude, or abilities that you have claimed, if he/she has not seen you demonstrate it before.)

Below are the requirements for achievement in each of the two areas.

1. Key competencies

- There are three levels of achievement for each competency: basic, proficient, and advanced.
- To reach the basic level of the competency, you need to be able to demonstrate that you have achieved all of the indicators in the "Basic" section.
- To reach the proficient level of the competency, you need to be able to demonstrate that you have reached all of the indicators in both the "Basic" and the "Proficient" sections.
- To reach the advanced level of the competency, you need to be able to demonstrate that you have achieved 100% of the indicators on the list.
- Upon confirmation of each indicator, you receive a signature from your SKYE leader.
- Upon completion of each level, you will receive a diploma.

2. Learning objectives

- There are 20 different topical learning objectives measured in the SKYE Passport, which come
 out of the four central learning objectives of the SKYE curriculum (active citizenship,
 employability, leadership, and social entrepreneurship).
- To complete one of the topical learning objectives, you must be able to demonstrate achievement of 100% of the indicators in the topic.
- Upon achieving 100% of the indicators, check with SKYE club leader for confirmation.
- If the SKYE club leader confirms your achievement, you receive a diploma for that topic area.
- You can collect diplomas in as many areas as you want, but do not necessarily need to collect them all.

SECTION 1: EVALUATION OF KEY COMPETENCIES

In this section of the Passport, you will be evaluating your level of achievement in the five key competencies of the SKYE program:

- Personal and Group Management
- Project Management
- Innovation and Creativity
- Communication
- Technical

Each of the competencies listed above has a corresponding chart on the following pages with a list of indicators. The chart for each competency is divided into three levels of achievement: basic, proficient, and advanced. Please take time to read through the lists and check off any indicators that are true for you. If you check off all the indicators in a certain section, it means you have achieved that level!

You should then bring your passport to your SKYE club leader and have him/her confirm that you have truly achieved that level. (Please note: although we trust you to be honest and sincere in this self-evaluation, your SKYE leader may ask you to demonstrate or prove that you truly have the knowledge, attitude, or abilities that you have claimed, if he/she has not seen you demonstrate it before.)

Once your SKYE leader has confirmed your achievement, you should receive a certificate indicating your level of competency development. Try to grow your competencies to the highest level possible!
